About this volunteer role

Our team provides work experience and friendship for vulnerable people and teaches children and young people how to look after the environment. As you can imagine, this is at the centre of the work we do and the services we provide. All activities are inspired by and, indeed, take place in and around our working farmyard, gardens, cafe and popular visitor centre, that attracts 30,000 people every year. While you will not be responsible for our trainees - we have seperate volunteers for that - you will be volunteering alongside them and the other volunteers and staff who do.

Role responsibilities

- Mucking out the animal pens
- Feeding the animals
- Assist in putting the animals out to pasture/back to stables
- Be aware of animal welfare

Knowledge, skills and experience

- Knowledge of large animal welfare or the willingness to learn
- Willing to get dirty as part of your volunteer role
- Reliability and flexibility to work on a range of tasks
- Willing to commit to this role for at least 6 months for a minimum of one session per week
- Experience of working in a farm/livestock/veterinary environment (desirable but not essential)
- Experience working within the disability sector (desirable but not essential)
- Experience in working in a community setting (desirable but not essential

Check requirements

All volunteers must provide two references. Some of our volunteer roles involve working with vulnerable adults in which case you will be required to complete a DBS check.

Learning and development

- Complete safeguarding adults learning modules online as required
- Attend Ouseburn Farm Volunteer Induction, Program Training and ongoing training as required
- Attend scheduled volunteer meetings

General Information

- We always act in accordance with the Ouseburn Farm Code of Conduct policy
- We are a Safe Place organisation, and all volunteers are required to comply with relevant procedure
- We comply with the Workplace Health and Safety management system
- We demonstrate skill, knowledge and behaviour to work with vulnerable adults in a respectful and enriching way
- Volunteers will be reimbursed for travel in line with our Volunteer Policy
- Volunteers attending for a full day will be offered free lunch and refreshments

As well as making a difference to a locally loved community resource, set among the beautiful surroundings of The Ouseburn, this is a great opportunity to meet people from a wide variety of backgrounds and to gain experience of working as part of a small, dedicated team.

As part of our promise to all of our volunteers, you will receive an introductory accredited Volunteer Induction as well as role specific training and support to help you carry out your volunteer role confidently and competently.
